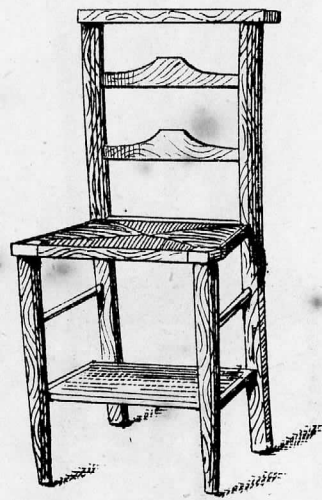


No. 23 AS SHOWN FOR KNEELING.
